



Betty Jean “Jeanne” Compton

March 20, 1941 - June 19, 2022

Betty Jean “Jeanne” Compton, 81, of Delbarton WV, transitioned to her heavenly home on Sunday, June 19, 2022 from the Pikeville Medical Center in Pikeville, KY. Born March 20, 1941, she was the youngest daughter of the late Rev. W.H. and Mildred Sexton Compton. She was preceded in death by a dear brother-in-law, Dallas T. Bias.

Jeanne was a devoted daughter to “Mid” and “Preacher Compton,” as they were affectionally called by church, family, and community. Jeanne was born just 2 years into her father’s 50-year pastoral appointment to Delbarton Church of God, and she became part of the legacy of a family’s multigenerational commitment to serving Christ and serving people through the church. Being an integral part of a church family was the only life she ever knew, and she served with her whole heart. She was, as were her siblings, an armorbearer to her father’s pastoral ministry. Jeanne and her sisters, Phyllis, Patty, and Joyce, sang on the radio from an early age during their father’s weekly radio program and also in church. Every member of the Compton family was involved in some facet of serving people. When their little brother Will was born, he was surrounded by a doting, caring, and protective group of sisters; and he too would find his calling early-on in the ministry.

The extended Compton family remains committed to Christ and committed to one other, maintaining closeness no matter how many miles might be between them. One of Jeanne’s favorite family roles was that of Aunt to her adoring nieces and nephews. Jeanne was fun, funny, and she had a youthfulness that was irresistible. If she really liked you, she would playfully smack you on the back while sharing a hearty laugh.

Jeanne lived in the home with her parents; and after her mother’s passing, Jeanne chose to remain there with her aging father, caring for him until his passing in 1997. She served in a variety of roles in the church during her lifetime. She was a Sunday School and Wednesday evening teacher for a number of years, a teacher during Vacation Bible School, and she played the church organ for many years. She also played the piano and was a vocal soloist with a rich alto voice.

After graduation, Jeanne’s first job was secretary at Burch High School. Jeanne then did clerical work at Appalachian Regional Hospital. She attended Lee College (now Lee University) and worked as an administrative secretary at Highlands Clinic. She then

served Delbarton Church of God/Regional Church of God in the role of church secretary for the remainder of her career years. She continued working until 2012. As the first person to answer the phone or greet church visitors, Jeanne made, during her years there, an excellent first impression to those who came through the doors. Jeanne was very much a people person. She was always friendly, always compassionate, and always speaking the truth in love. She was very transparent, a good and patient listener, and people trusted her because they knew she loved them genuinely.

Jeanne was quick-witted and quick on her feet. When the church hosted Regional Christian School in the building beginning in 1999, Jeanne was loved by the students and faculty alike. She would make countless trips up and down the stairs throughout the day without complaining. She put bandages on skinned knees, comforted crying kindergarteners, and even though her secretarial role was geared more to the “church side of things,” she devoted a great deal of energy to serving the school as well.

In more recent years, as Jeanne’s health began to decline, she got to spend a lot less time doing the things she loved—church involvement, traveling, and social gatherings. When a stroke caused her to become less steady on her feet, her siblings pulled together and helped her. She spent a great deal of time with Joyce and husband Tom in Chesapeake, and an extended stay in Florida with Patty and Leon when her health was too fragile to travel back home. Will and Bonnie and Phyllis were also a great source of support for Jeanne, staying close by her side, driving when she could no longer do so, and helping her with anything she needed; also, several friends and church family served occasionally as in-home caregivers the last few years. Jeanne did not allow sickness or circumstances to diminish her joy or her faith in the Lord Jesus. She remained true to the very end; and now for her, life is just beginning.

Jeanne is survived by her cherished siblings: sisters, Phyllis Bias of Delbarton, Patricia (Leon) Garner of Sabastian, FL, Joyce (Tom) Maynard of Chesapeake, OH; brother, William (Bonnie) Compton of Delbarton. She also leaves behind a number of nieces and nephews; and a special friend and caregiver, Neva McCoy.

Chafin Funeral Home has been entrusted with serving this family in Jeanne’s passing. Special thanks to the doctors and nursing staff of Pikeville Medical Center ICU, Dr. Meyer and Dr. Rebel; also SICU nurses Jacqueline Mollett (day shift) and Terra Weddington (night shift).

A Celebration of Life for Jeanne will be held on Thursday, June 2,3 at 1:00 PM at Regional Church of God with her nephew, Pastor Mitchell Bias, officiating; also remarks by her brother, Pastor Will Compton; brother-in-law, Pastor Leon Garner; as well as Pastor Stewart Farley, and Pastor Rick Hisle. Visitation will be at the church on Wednesday evening from 6:00-9:00 PM. Friends and nephews will serve as pallbearers. Jeanne will be laid to rest at Mountain View Memory Gardens in Maher, WV, next to her beloved parents. Pastor Greg Tomlinson will serve at the graveside committal. In lieu of floral


