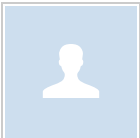

As electricians in A-Gang's A-8 shop, we spent many hours/days/weeks solving complicated and sometimes simple trouble shooting adventures. Of course, it's always the misadventures that are remembered the best. I recall Scott and I were working on Deck Edge Door Nr. 3 for the flight deck elevator...you know...one of those elevators that take the jets from the hanger bay to the flight deck to then be launched to do the nation's bidding. We were elbows deep in wires pulled apart looking for an electrical ground when our division officer swung by and told us we had to take a break and work on a much more important piece of equipment. The Officer's Ward Room's Soft Serve Ice Cream Machine (The "Dog") was broken and needed to be fixed ASAP. Although we grumbled as good Sailors do...we fixed the Dog and then the door. It was late night, but we had lots to talk about.
