



Waville Baisden Dempsey

January 12, 1933 - December 8, 2020

Waville (Baisden) Dempsey, 87, a lifelong resident of the Lenore area, entered the presence of God on Tuesday, December 8, 2020. She passed away peacefully, in the comfort of her home, with her family by her side. She epitomized the roles of a devoted wife, loving mother, doting grandmother and great-grandmother, homemaker, teacher, and having steadfast Christian faith.

The second of 10 children born to Smith and Frankie (Evans) Baisden, she was born January 12, 1933, at the family home, in Lenore.

She married her beloved husband, Fred Dempsey, on June 29, 1950. They were together for 69 years until being separated by his death on June 6, 2019. Together, they raised their three children with an abundance of love, instilling in each of them a devotion to God, the value of family, and dedication to life's work.

Mrs. Dempsey earned her degree in education from Marshall College, what is today Marshall University, and later obtained her Master's. She would become a well-respected educator, following in the footsteps of her dad, who was a former teacher.

Mrs. Dempsey had the rather unique privilege of teaching her own family members. She counted her youngest daughter, three nephews, and several

grandchildren among her students throughout her career, yet favoritism was never demonstrated. As students in her classroom, everyone was among equals. Her soft-spoken manner, as well as extending respect to students and parents, she was endeared to all. Upon retirement in 1987, she had served the children of the Myrtle and Lenore areas for 37 years.

Mrs. Dempsey dedicated her life to God early on, holding tremendous faith throughout her life. Her brother-in-law and aunt were the founders of Parsley Bottom Free Will Baptist Church, in Lenore, and it was there she served as a faithful member her entire Christian life. Active in many facets of the church, among her notable roles were Sunday School teacher, former president of the Ladies Auxiliary, and assisting in the food pantry. She was beloved not only by members of her home church, but churches throughout the Tug Valley area, and was affectionally called "Sister Waville".

A consummate source of love and compassion, with a meaningful, sincere manner, and inimitable sweetness, she would remind her children, grandchildren, siblings, nephews, nieces, and friends that God was always near as an ever-present help. She regularly studied the Bible, which wasn't a mere collection of verses and stories, but rather a guide by which she patterned and lived her life.

Although physical ailments had recently claimed her mobility, and time cruelly began to rob her of memories, she maintained her sweet and kind nature, as well as her firm faith. Even as her health waned, she spoke of God's goodness and blessings in her life.

Through death we know she has been granted the fulfillment of the promise given to believers in Christ Jesus. Mrs. Dempsey has now been reunited in eternity with her dear parents, loving husband, Fred; and siblings, Harley "Bull" Baisden, Clayton "Cap" Baisden, Christine "Cricket" Whitt, and Greg

Baisden.

She is survived by her three loyal and cherished children, along with their spouses, all of whom provided her with abiding love and care: son, Rick Dempsey, and his wife, Sandra; daughters, Denne Newsome, and her husband, Thomas; and Joey Dempsey, and her husband, Paul; all of whom are residents of the Lenore area. She's also survived by her six grandchildren: Tommy Newsome, Russ Dempsey, Tonya Filek, Nikki Hinkle, Paul David Dempsey, and Amanda Dickey; as well as her 15 great-grandchildren: Ryder, Teague, Titus, Beatrice, and Porter Dempsey; Madelyn and Nate Hinkle; Tyler, Alyssa and Andrea Newsome; Ashton Filek, Cole and Callie Dempsey, Mason and Calvin Dickey.

Additional survivors include her sisters: Ivadenne Hatfield, of Williamson, WV; Eunice Ford, of Summit Station OH, and Virginia Parsons, of Barboursville, WV; brothers, Bill Baisden, of Lenore; and Guy Baisden, of Port Orange, FL; as well as ten adoring nephews and nieces.

Mrs. Dempsey's legacy of loving kindness has affected countless lives. Her humble heart extended grace toward others that will live on in the memories of those she impacted throughout her life's journey.

A private service will be held at Parsley Bottom Free Will Baptist Church under the direction of Chafin Funeral Home. Mrs. Dempsey will be laid to rest at Mountain View Memory Gardens, at Maher, WV.
